Uhuru park explosion; government vows to get to the bottom of incident

Three people were confirmed dead as of Sunday night following two explosions in the middle of a crowd that had gathered at Uhuru Park Nairobi to attend the No campaigns on the proposed constitution. Five were said to be critically injured as authorities gave 75 the number of others admitted to Kenyatta National Hospital nursing injuries. Prime Minister Raila Odinga who spoke moments later at the hospital, condemned the act saying proper investigations will be conducted to clear any doubt as to who was behind it.

Others who had accompanied the Premier included internal security minister Professor George Saitoti and the Police. The prayers at the rally saw politicians led by Higher education minister William Ruto, Mutito MP Kiema Kilonzo, Housing assistant minister Bishop Margaret Wanjiru in attendance. Meanwhile, Fish FM Managing Director Reuben Kigame who condemned the incident says in spite of what happened ministers of the gospel should continue defending the position of the church on the proposed constitution.
